

Putting you first

Our expert teaching staff know what it takes to succeed, and their teaching can have an impact beyond the classroom. Many have postgraduate qualifications and/or industry experience, and act as mentors and advisors to help you gain a deeper understanding of your subject. They aim to help you develop your skills for your future career.

Don't just take our word for it. In 2017, we were awarded the top accolade, Gold, in the Teaching Excellence Framework (TEF), a government ranking that rates teaching at UK universities. We were named the number one Modern University in the Midlands in the Guardian University Guide 2021, and were shortlisted for University of the Year in The Times and Sunday Times Good University Guide 2021.

Our most important feedback comes from our students and we use this to understand what we're doing well and where we can enhance our offering. Students elect course representatives to communicate the views of fellow students to their tutors and other university staff. Student governors also represent these views at board level.

In 2020, we committed to a new learning experience, and embraced the active, collaborative, mobile-first digital learning platform, Aula. All students now use Aula to support their studies on campus. On campus, many courses¹ have the facilities to give you the opportunity to immerse yourself in close-to-real-life situations. Depending on your course, you could experience what it's like to work in an operating theatre, a courtroom or a television studio. We offer innovative ways of learning too, like our Disruptive Media Learning Lab, which incorporates games and playful thinking. 

Accreditation




Retail

As a fundamental element of our corporate strategy, Coventry University continues to invest heavily in its future. We believe that if our students commit to make us their chosen place of learning, then we need to give them the very best facilities possible when they arrive.



TheHub – The Courtyard

Built around you

If you make us your first choice university, we will aim to give you the best facilities possible. That's why we continue to invest heavily in our future, so you can invest in yours.

Our investment in infrastructure underpins the excellence of our activities, offering you world-class spaces for education, research and enterprise. We continue to drive our performance and output through digital and technology-led transformation. We aim to support and improve our core pillars for student experience, teaching and learning, research, and enterprise capability.

Coventry University Group¹ is committed to investing in excess of £400m over the next 10 years or so. These include some very significant projects; completed, in progress and due to start in the coming year.

We have already started work on some major projects to further enhance our campus network for our students, staff and visitors. This work will enable the development of new, modern spaces, and we are investing significant funds in the coming years to further improve the working environment for students and staff. These new facilities should help to address emerging expectations in student experience and research.

A number of demolitions have now taken place and work has started on the former Civic Centre and James Starley Building sites. Inventor of the Penny Farthing and the Coventry Tricycle, James Starley is generally regarded as the father of the modern-day bicycle industry. On the site of the old James Starley Building, we have started landscaping the new Starley Gardens. This eco-friendly landscaping scheme will benefit students, staff and the wider community by providing a tranquil zone that promotes wellness in the heart of the campus and Coventry city centre. As well as opening up the whole area, the new gardens will maximise the view of Coventry Cathedral from other university buildings.

We are also working on a significant long-term project to transform the site of the former Coventry City Council buildings into new university buildings. Demolition was completed in 2020 and redevelopment of the site has been paused while the site is used as part of the City of Culture celebrations in 2021. The approved plans retain parts of the old Grade II listed Civic Centre 2 building in the design of the new building. The medieval vaults, which are also

Grade II listed, have been integrated into the building and will be used as part of the new facilities.

The new £25m Beatrice Shilling Building, named after the celebrated aeronautical engineer and successful motorcycle racer, was opened in 2020. This facility includes a gaming and virtual reality studio, a specialist area for 3D printing and rapid prototyping, a laser facility, and physics and electronics laboratories. It links to the existing Engineering and Computing Building with an elevated glass walkway.

The current art and design, and humanities buildings are also being reworked, which will result in a modern and all-encompassing 'super' building, due by late 2022 (subject to change).

We have reviewed our city-wide catering facilities to improve your campus experience and opened new cafés in three buildings for students, staff and visitors. We have refreshed and improved our current catering facilities at other locations and have plans for additional developments.

We are committed to environmental responsibility and sustainability. Our library now has brighter and more energy-efficient lighting, and we have renewed our energy centres in three of our main buildings to reduce our consumption and carbon footprint. Our buildings create spaces that support enhanced innovative and collaborative experiences for new methods of learning.

At Coventry University London, the new Cutlers Exchange in Devonshire Square gives an extra 20,000 square feet of new teaching spaces, a postgraduate centre, a financial suite, seven new collaborative working spaces and a new event space. The facility features the latest technologies, including Bloomberg terminals, computer and IT labs, and a Standard and Poor's Market Intelligence Suite.

All students at Coventry University London benefit from the extra studying and learning space as well as the breakout areas. Postgraduate students now also benefit from their own dedicated centre and facilities.



Student support

At Coventry, we understand that your student experience is shaped by getting quick answers to your everyday queries, support to ensure your wellbeing, and extra academic help when you need it.

To aid your learning experience, you'll find Information Points across campus with welcoming, knowledgeable advisors who can help you with a wide range of queries. We also offer specialist support with learning, academic writing, IT, mathematics and statistics.

We have a dedicated Student Engagement Centre with a friendly team of advisers to help you before you arrive, while you settle in and then throughout your studies. The team can help you settle into university life, and make the most of the available opportunities to succeed in your studies and achieve your goals.

Additional academic support

Our dedicated Centre for Academic Writing (CAW) is on hand to provide guidance on all your writing tasks throughout your degree, including your dissertation or final-year project. CAW offers face-to-face and online writing tutorials, drop-ins, and writing development workshops, as well as Add+vantage modules to help you improve your academic writing (appointments may be required).

If you need help with statistics or mathematics, whatever your course, our popular support centre, **sigma**, can help. It provides in-person and online assistance throughout term time and for several vacation weeks. We offer drop-in support and pre-booked appointments, as well as workshops to revise key A level topics and develop skills in statistics and numerical reasoning. Health and wellbeing service

Our specialist teams include welfare officers, counsellors and mental health advisers, and hate and harassment case management. They provide support for a wide range of issues or concerns, such as health or relationships. Services are confidential and, following an initial assessment, students may be offered one-to-one counselling or referred to specialist external organisations.

If you are a student with a disability, our Disability Support Team will provide you with guidance and assistance from when you apply, to when you graduate. We offer support to students with a variety of disabilities, including specific learning difficulties (dyslexia); physical and sensory disabilities; and Asperger's (autistic spectrum).

The Spirituality and Faith Centre is located at the heart of the campus and is a warm, safe environment for all students and staff, whatever your beliefs. Facilities include a multi-faith meeting room and library, chapel, Muslim prayer rooms (with ablution facilities), lounge and kitchen. You can also make private appointments with our multi-faith chaplains.

The Lanchester Library



Open 24 hours a day, 364 days a year, the Lanchester Library offers a range of study environments across five floors. There are workspaces for silent and individual study as well as quiet and group areas, and bookable rooms.

Through our Disruptive Media Learning Lab (DMLL), we aim to inspire and challenge you to think and act differently when you study. It also offers experimental learning areas such as The Grass and The Hill.

The library also houses the university's IT Tech Bar where you can find 1,400 individual study spaces and more than 500 computer workstations, and our free laptop loan service. You will also have access to more than a million learning resources at your fingertips, from ebooks and e-journals to print and multimedia resources. Wi-Fi is available throughout the building.

A team of dedicated academic liaison librarians are available to provide specialist help and support. They work with course tutors and offer both class teaching and one-to-one appointments. Together with our enquiry services, we aim to ensure that you have everything you need to support your studies.

Getting to Coventry

Coventry railway station is just a 10-minute walk from campus and currently operates regular services on routes including Birmingham, London, Manchester, Leeds and Bristol, as well as to local stations (subject to change).

The main coach and bus station is right on the doorstep of the campus, with regular services to both local and national destinations and cities.

The university is just a 15-minute drive from the M6 and M69, and less than 20 minutes from the M42 and M40. There is also a student car park on campus that costs just £2 to park all day¹.

Birmingham Airport is the closest international airport to Coventry, and is just a short train or bus journey away. The closest London airports are Luton and Heathrow. If you fly into Birmingham or London Heathrow Airports, we offer a free airport transfer service at www.coventry.ac.uk/airport-transfers.

If you live locally, then you also have the option of walking or cycling. There are plenty of sheltered bike-locking areas on campus. You can download local cycling maps and plan your journey by visiting www.coventry.gov.uk.

Coventry University Students' Union is a charity that exists to improve the experience of students across the Coventry University Group. The union is run by students for students to help you make the most of your time at university.

When you enrol at the university, you automatically become a member of the students' union and gain access to a year-round programme of events, campaigns, support, representation, advice and personal development. Sports clubs

You can put the experiences you can gain in these and other roles towards the Leadership Award. This is a formal recognition of the skills and expertise you've developed alongside your degree. It recognises that your extra-curricular activities will continue to provide lasting benefits beyond your time with us.




Sport Coventry

Previous students have attended an annual economics students meeting in Poland, and have gone on exchanges with partner universities in Germany and China.

Possible careers

They also give the students the opportunity of exposure to how businesses and other organisations operate in different markets and contexts. Recent economics graduates have entered careers including derivative traders, swaps analysts and marketing managers, with a range of prestigious employers including the Bank of England, the Government Economic Service, Vodafone and HSBC.

Studying law can sharpen the mind, build an analytical skillset and develop problem-solving abilities – qualities that are not just valued in the legal field but in business and many other professions too. We've been teaching law for more than 50 years and, by studying a law degree with us, you will have the opportunity to benefit from this wealth of experience.

Our Law LLB (Hons) course gives you the opportunity to gain the foundations of legal knowledge in Years 1 and 2. 

Our Ethical Hacking and Cybersecurity BSc (Hons) offers you the opportunity to learn, identify and analyse the threats posed to modern information structures. You can develop the knowledge and skills to advise companies on how to secure their systems. The course places a strong emphasis on sound investigative procedures and the logging and reporting of incidents. This is an essential skill if you want to work within law enforcement agencies or consultant organisations.

Our Games Technology BSc (Hons) course gives you the opportunity to develop your understanding of code design, testing and graphics, while equipping you with specialist skills in programming. The university has access to industry-standard software, including Unity Games Engine, 3DS Max and Visual Studio. This course aims to give you a distinct advantage in starting your career, with recent graduates or internship students undertaking placements at Microsoft, Exient, Sony and Pixel Toys.

Information Technology for Business BSc (Hons) is designed to help prepare you for careers in the design, delivery and management of IT systems within a business. The skills you learn could also be applicable to careers in web development, data analysis, content management, business analysis and project management. The Blitz

During the Second World War many of Britain's towns and cities were bombed. The raids aimed to disrupt vital industries and to destroy the morale of the people.

As a centre of war production, Coventry was one of the first to suffer a major attack. The most severe raid happened on 14 November 1940. This devastated the city and left the cathedral a burning shell. At least 554 people were killed and over 1000 were injured.

During the war Coventry suffered a total of 54 bombing raids. Over 1200 people were killed and one third of the city's housing and quarters of its factories were damaged.

Top-up courses

We offer a number of courses that enable students to 'top-up' their existing qualifications to gain a full undergraduate degree.

If you have successfully completed a Higher National Diploma (HND) or Foundation Degree and want to study further, a top-up degree could allow you to progress onto the final year of an honours degree course. There may also be the opportunity to enter some courses in the second year if you have a Higher National Certificate (HNC).



CU campuses

CU offers a flexible style of university education that is designed to fit around your life. We aim to provide career-focused courses, coupled with placement opportunities to help prepare you for the world of work^{1,2}.

Students can benefit from a variety of modern teaching facilities and a choice of four campuses. We offer a range of academic qualifications, all of which are awarded by Coventry University.

A nationwide offering

The relationship between CU campuses gives you the opportunity to move between each campus after completing an academic year³. This means you can study in Coventry, London or on the Yorkshire coast, in Scarborough.

The CU Coventry campus relocated to a new £33m teaching space in March 2019. This is designed to give students a bright, open learning environment.

CU London's Dagenham campus opened in 2017 and is based in the Grade II listed former Dagenham Civic Centre. In 2020, CU London launched an additional campus in the heart of the Greenwich Peninsula in the modern Mitre Passage building.

CU Scarborough, located on the stunning North Yorkshire coast, opened its seaside campus in September 2016. The student-centred design means everything you may need is located under one roof.

Study modes that fit modern lifestyles

CU offers a number of flexible study options, ensuring you can study at a pace that suits you.

Full-time classes take place at a fixed time each day, either in the morning or afternoon, so you are able to plan your studies around your life. At CU, we understand a September start doesn't suit everyone, which is why we also offer November, January, February, April and June intakes³.

If you want to study for your degree part-time⁴, we offer two evening classes a week at Coventry and Scarborough. There is also the option to start your degree at several times during the year: October, January, April and June⁵.

For selected courses, you could complete your degree in two years via accelerated learning. You'll follow the full-time study pattern but you will study six blocks per year instead of the standard four, thereby completing your degree in two years rather than three.

An alternative style of university education

CU's offering is specifically tailored to make higher education accessible. We try to keep our class sizes small to give you even more contact hours with tutors and, in an attempt to ease the pressure of university life, we've moved away from end-of-year exams.

We offer a range of BA, BSc, BEng and LLB qualifications (certain courses are only available at specific campuses). Our courses are also available as HNC Level 4 and HND Level 5 stages.

Foundation years provide an entry route into degree-level study. They are suitable for those who have completed some Level 3 study, such as A levels, and want to change subject area, or for those who don't meet the entry criteria to start a degree. If you successfully pass the foundation year, you are guaranteed a place on a relevant CU degree course.

At CU Coventry and CU Scarborough, we offer a range of Access to Higher Education courses. These are Level 3 qualifications that help students without traditional qualifications to prepare for higher education study. They offer an introduction to a subject area as well as providing the skills needed for study at university. If you successfully pass your Access diploma, you are guaranteed a place on a relevant course at CU.



Entry requirements

You will need to meet the entry requirements for each of our undergraduate courses. Once we have received your application, we will assess your qualification results, and your predicted grades, along with your personal statement and reference. If you are unsure about something before you submit your application, please contact us for advice.

Within this prospectus, you will find typical A level and BTEC entry requirement grades for each course. We also accept a wide range of other qualifications, including the International Baccalaureate (IB) Diploma, Cambridge Technicals (CTEC), Access qualifications and equivalent international qualifications. We may also require you to have studied certain subjects at GCSE or A level¹ for some courses. We have a Fair Access Scheme, where we take into account an applicant's personal circumstances and background. To find out more visit www.coventry.ac.uk/fairaccess.

Some of our courses (especially those that are creative or professional in nature) may also require you to attend an interview, audition or portfolio showcase session. This allows us to assess your suitability as well as giving you the opportunity to find out more about what your course involves and whether it's right for you. Fees and finance

Tuition fees – Our tuition fees are published on our website. Fees for September 2022 are still to be confirmed, so please continue to check the course pages on the website for the latest information. Fees for students applying from outside the UK vary.

Cost of living – As well as your course fees, you will also need to consider the cost of living. While this will depend on your lifestyle and spending habits, you could find your money goes further here in Coventry than in many other parts of the UK. For example Numbeo.com, a worldwide database, listed the cost of living index in Coventry as 17% lower than in London, and rent on average 61% lower than London in December 2020².

Financial support – As a UK undergraduate student, you may be entitled to two types of financial support – tuition fee loans and maintenance loans.

A tuition fee loan usually covers your course fees in full per year and is paid directly to the university. However, you can also apply for a maintenance loan to help you with your living costs while at university. This is paid directly into your bank account, usually in three instalments throughout the year, at the start of each semester³.

Student loans are not like standard loans that you would receive from a bank. You only start repaying them once you are employed and are earning over a certain amount of money per year. The earliest you'll start repaying is the April after you leave your course.

You can apply directly to us for part-time study or if you're applying from outside the UK through our application portal. If you are applying through UCAS, be sure to submit your application before the January 2022 deadline (subject to change).

5. Wait

Keep an eye on any updates to your application on My UCAS Application. You can sign in at any point after you have applied and you will be able to check if any of your university choices have offered you a place, as well as reply to your offers.

6. Reply

Once you have received all your decisions from the universities to which you have applied, the next step is to choose your 'Firm' and 'Insurance' choices. To help you decide, we invite all our offer holders to on-campus or virtual events, normally held in February, March and April of the year of entry.

8. Welcome

We look forward to welcoming all new students to our student community. As well as enrolling and accessing your learning materials, during Freshers' Week, you'll have the opportunity to make new friends and find out more about our Students' Union societies.

7. Results

If you are awaiting results, check My UCAS Application on results day to see whether you have been accepted onto the course. If you have not received the grades you were expecting, please get in touch with us – we may have spaces available through Adjustment or Clearing.




